The Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Fulbright's national deadline is in October. Candidates applying through U.S. institutions must apply by their campus deadline. The SFCM campus deadline is three weeks before the national deadline. SFCM candidates are required to meet with Fulbright Program Adviser Ryan Brown before applying.

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program offers fellowships abroad for one academic year to graduating college seniors, graduate students, young professionals, scientists and artists. The program seeks self-starters capable of contributing to, and benefiting from, an intensive cultural exchange program.

Those eligible for the program include recent graduates, master's and doctoral candidates, and young professionals (including creative and performing artists).

Factors in selection include:

- The extent to which the candidate and the project will help to advance the Fulbright aim of promoting
- mutual understanding among nations through engagement in the host community, among other
- activities
- The quality and feasibility of the proposal as described in the Statement of Grant Purpose
- Applicant's desirability of achieving wide institutional and geographic distribution
- Language preparation (if applicable)

Classical musicians interested in a performance-based proposal will submit an arts application. Those with over five years of professional experience may consider applying for the Fulbright Scholar Program.

The online application is open from late March through early October, but SFCM's campus deadline will be in September.

Fulbright applications require extensive supplemental materials, including unedited video recordings. *For a successful submission, it is essential that applicants begin gathering materials early.*

Allowance covers travel, room, board and other expenses – (approximately \$8,500). Three to four are awarded per year. *Deadline: Early December*

Applicants must be college faculty, secondary school teachers, graduate students ABD, or musicians/artists. Average awards are \$20,000 to only one musician per semester.
