Panoramic Housing

Located at 1321 Mission Street in San Francisco's bustling SoMa district, the Panoramic is a brand-new high-rise residence for students, offering affordable apartments with full kitchens, natural light, expansive views, and spaces for study, socializing, and practice—all less than a ten-minute walk from SFCM.

All first-year, second-year, and third-year undergraduates stay at the Panoramic. As a resident, you'll enjoy immediate access to transit (BART and Muni); cultural landmarks including the San Francisco Symphony, San Francisco Opera, Center for New Music, and SFJAZZ Center; farmers' markets and grocery stores (Trader Joe's, Whole Foods, and others); and shopping, cafes, and restaurants. The Panoramic also lies at the heart of San Francisco's thriving tech district.

SFCM students occupy the top five floors of this 11-story building. Rooms include two-person studios (274-295 sq. ft.) or four-person suites (605-630 sq. ft. corner units). Each room includes a fully equipped kitchen with a convection microwave oven, flat-screen TV, WiFi, engineered soundproofing, and more!

The Panoramic reflects a commitment to sustainability and environmental consciousness. The building and rooms feature natural light and ventilation, enhanced indoor air quality, LED lighting, low-flow plumbing fixtures, and Energy Star appliances.

Resident Assistants (RAs) support all students living at the Panoramic and host regular programs and events that help build a strong Conservatory community.

Financial Aid

We're here to help our talented students and their families manage the cost of world-class music education through a wide variety of sources. Conservatory financial aid generally falls into two categories: gift assistance (SFCM scholarships, federal and state grants) and self-help assistance (loans and work opportunities). The recipient may accept all or any part of the aid offered, and may also sign up for an installment payment program.

Students who are United States citizens or permanent residents applying for any federal financial aid need only complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This can be found at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Federal aid includes Pell Grants, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG), Direct Loans, both subsidized and unsubsidized, Perkins Loans, and Work Study. Our federal school code for the FAFSA is 001278. **Please make sure your 2017-2018 FAFSA information is correct.** The most efficient way to do so is to use the FAFSA's IRS Data Retrieval Tool, which imports data directly from your IRS records.

International students applying for Conservatory scholarship assistance, including merit scholarships, must complete the forms on our website, which include the Institutional Certification of Finances and the CSS / Financial Aid PROFILE (school code: 4744). All first-time domestic financial aid applicants who are applying for any need-based SFCM scholarship are required to complete the CSS/ Financial Aid PROFILE (school code: 4744).

Students planning to attend the Conservatory are encouraged to apply for local, state, and national scholarships. If you are a California resident, please visit www.csac.ca.gov to apply for the California State Grant. The deadline to apply is March 2. Please keep in mind that both your FAFSA and California State Grant application must be completed by this date.

Facilities

The Conservatory is just a three-minute walk from Davies Symphony Hall and the War Memorial Opera House, and just one block from a major public transit hub. In addition to state-of-the art classrooms, practice rooms, teaching studios, and three performance halls, students enjoy a large library and listening room, two high-tech recording studios, a computer lab, a rooftop terrace, and café.

Designed by world-class acousticians Kirkegaard and Associates, the building's cutting-edge acoustics include completely isolated "floating rooms" and adjustable sound absorption systems, with each space tailored to its specific acoustic requirements.

S Level: TAC electronic music recording, mixing, and sound studios; keyboard and computer lab, percussion suite, Osher Salon

C Level: Café Crème, reed-making room, Sol Joseph Recital Hall

Level 1 and 1A: Entrance, security desk, box office, Phyllis Wattis Atrium, Caroline C. Hume Concert Hall

- **Level 2**: Deleage Family Reception Area, Pre-College and Adult Extension Division, executive suite, conference room, group interviews
- **Level 3**: Classrooms, practice rooms, faculty studios and offices, Baroque Studio
- **Level 4**: Student Services and administrative offices: Admission, Financial Aid, Registrar, Marketing, Communications, and Development
- **Level 5**: Student lounge and computer lab, vending machines, classrooms, practice rooms, faculty studios
- Level 6: Milton Salkind Terrace, library, listening lab, faculty studios

Restrooms on levels 1-4 and 6 are located near the elevators. Restrooms on level 5 are near the center of the floor and on level C are on the north wall (opposite the main entrance and box office).
